We will meet, as usual, at the Cincinnati Gem, Mineralogy and Jewelry Show on Saturday May 4, 1991. The show is held at the Cincinnati Gardens, 2250 Seymour Avenue. Please see map on back of show flyer. The meeting will start at 3:00 p.m. with Dr. Carl Francis of Harvard's Mineralogy Museum who will speak about Harvard's Finest Minerals. A brief business meeting will follow the talk. Dr. Francis is a most accomplished speaker and his topic should be of great interest. Indiana folks need to be aware of the 1 hour time difference between there and Ohio now that Daylight Savings Time is in force. I hope to see you all there.

If your name does <u>not</u> appear on the enclosed list, please pay your 1991 dues. Dues are \$17.00 (\$10.00 for additional member of the same family). Dues include chapter and national dues, newsletters, insurance, field trip updates, speakers, etc.

Jan. 20, 1991 Minutes

Twelve people attended a very interesting demonstration of the scanning Electron Microscope by Dr. Harlan Roepke at Ball State University, Muncie, Indiana.

A brief business meeting started at 4:45 p.m., November 1990 minutes were read and approved. The treasurer reported a balance of \$306.62 + \$32.00 in development funds.

The president has a list of our past programs available if you are interested in obtaining them.

One upcoming meeting will be at the Bedford/Bloomington Show in June. Fliers will be available at the March meeting.

We discussed meeting times with no conclusions. More on this later.

The field trip chairman Bob Hartup has reported no luck so far. He will send out letters to mines to explain that we are professional, self-insured, careful, and dedicated people. The possible trips include Flemingsburg, Stone Cave, and Rensellaer.

No program as of yet for March, the May meeting will be at the Cincinnati show.

The meeting adjourned at 5:05 p.m.

March 9, 1991 Minutes

The meeting was held in the park building at White Water State Park, Union County. First, we listened to an interesting talk by Dr. Jon Branstrator from Earlham College on Indiana Fossils. His talk and the succeeding field trip were sponsored by the park as part of their Second Annual "Fossil Day" with arrangements by Ray Dickerson. About 25 people attended the lecture.

While we ate our "brown bag" lunch, Dr. Harlan Roepke, in the absence of the president, chaired a very brief meeting of about 12 members.

January, 1991 minutes were read and approved. Treasurer reported a balance of \$450.62 + \$26.00 in the development fund. We have 23 paid members as of this meeting. The treasurer was advised to pay liability insurance for the year.

Our May meeting will be on May 4, immediately following the afternoon lectures at the Cincinnati Gem & Mineral Show.

Maps and directions were passed out and the meeting was adjourned so that we all could drive to the fossil hunt at the new road cut south of Brookville.


