Because President David Straw could not be present, he had asked Janet Clifford to preside in his absence. She welcomed those in attendance, who were there for the annual Micromineral Symposium. The minutes of the meeting held in Greenfield in September were approved as printed in the newsletter. Treasurer Lorraine Wright had sent a report showing a balance of \$1,020 in the checking account and \$1,681 in the savings account for a total of \$2,701. The report was accepted, subject to audit. She said that the chapter had sent \$200 each to the Indiana State Museum and the Clement Mineral Museum in Kentucky. She reminded members to send in 2009 dues, which are \$15 for the first member in a household and \$10 for each additional member. 
