Special Program on GEODES

Vice-president Nelson Shaffer introduced Graduate Student Ken Tankersley. Ken is working on a Ph.D at IU with research on Paleo-Minerals of the Mammoth Cave System. He is also with the Glenn Black Museum. He showed a video tape taken from a 1935 movie film showing the rescue of an Indian Mummy in Mammoth Cave. The mummy was under a huge boulder and had probably been mining gypsum from the soil. "Lost John" was the name tagged to the Indian Mummy. He is believed to be between 500 and 1500 years old. Greater exploration in 1984 revealed many foot prints- some bare foot prints and some of woven sandals. Many walls show scrapes, charred ends of cane which were used for light and many partially burned torches.

It is reasoned that the carbonates were of no interest. The sulfates- gypsum

flowers, Epsonite grew seasonally.

"Little Al" another Indian Mummy was found in Salt Cave. He had fallen from a ledge. This place has been dubbed "Mummy Hall".

It is thought that Satin Spar crystals are ceremonial or pseudo-relegious to the

Indians. The crystals are plentiful.

This was a very interesting presentation. It answered questions about cave miner-

als and raised many more. If only those mummys could talk!

President Rich Eddy gave a welcome to all and introduced Richard and Virginia Eddy, his father and mother. Richard is a member and has attended field trips with us in 1988.

Wanda Aldred gave the treasurers report and minutes had been printed in the newsletter. A motion to accept these reports was made by Terry Huizing, seconded by George Aldred, motion carried.
