

# INDIANA CHAPTER, FRIENDS OF MINERALOGY, INC. INDIANA STATE MUSEUM JAN. 14, 1990

President Rich Eddy opened the meeting by welcoming everyone. He announced a series of programs to run for six weeks on PBS "The Miracle Planet! Check your local station for time and day. 1990 is the year of the environment.

Minutes were approved as published. Treasurer's report \$132.11 in the general fund. \$35.00 in the membership development fund. The bill for secretary's expense for 1989 was directed to be paid. Rich Eddy will audit treasurer's books and report to National Friends of Mineralogy.

Program: Rich then introduced the speaker, Dr. Harlan Roepke, who is Professor of Geology at Ball State University. Dr. Roepke showed models of crystal structure of calcite, diamond, graphite, and other minerals. The first books on crystalography were published in 1556. In 1600, relationships of crystal faces, then chemical analysis of minerals were published. Atoms, that make up mineral composition, were first a geometrical determination of crystal shapes and relations, now the structural shape of minerals are determined by X-rays today. A very interesting program.

Business: Dr. Roepke stated that his name is spelled with 2 "a" s Harlan.

The group should plan to hold one meeting in the north end of the state as consideration to those members who always have to drive south. This could possibly be held in conjunction with the Dune Land or Lafayette shows.

The Club will be involved with the July 19-22, 1990 Midwest Federation Show at Evansville. Contact members will be Vic Hurm and John Doty.

Service to Public is a purpose of Friends of Mineralogy. Another service would be to help the Lawrence County Rock Club who will be holding the Swap in a new area this year, Bloomington-Monroe County Fair-grounds, June 22-24.

Rich requested assistance with the newsletter. Resolution to assist was unanimous.

Secretary-Treasurer: There were nominations but all declined. Sylvia Sicree said she was a very new member at this meeting but would be willing to take the job for next year. Wanda Aldred then volunteered to finish the year as secretary-treasurer. Motion made by Shaffer, seconded by Harris Precht. Motion carried.

Swanson announced that the annual Mineral-Fossil Day at the State Museum has been moved to October.

Field Trips. Swanson. Richard Eddy will work on the week-end trip to Upper Michigan. Vern Swanson will work on the trip to Salem in May. Rich Crosslin will work on a trip to Rensselaer. George Aldred will work on entry to a quarry in Southern Indiana. Also mentioned was a trip to the Three Corners Area, Herculanium, MO. lead mines. There is barite, zink, antimony also the St. Joseph Museum. John Medici will lead another trip to Ohio.

Rick Crosslin: Introduced Dr. Douglas Martin who has joined the Chapter. Rick would like leads, maps, etc. to minerals in the Hot Springs, ARK. area.

Margaret Kahrs: The mineral-Fossil Bill has been presented to the legislature by John Hill.

Meeting adjourned at 2:30.
