President Rich Eddy opened the meeting. Today the program will follow the business session.

Minutes: No corrections. Wendell Spitler moved and George Aldred seconded that they be approved as printed in the newsletter. Motion carried. Treasurers Report: \$429.49 with \$35.00 in the membership development fund. Bills were for newsletter postage. Insurance will be due in April, hopefully with no increase.

George Aldred moved to make Ron Richards an Honorary Member with dues to be paid from the development fund. Second by Vern Swanson. Motion carried.

Membership is now 38.

National Friends of Mineralogy meeting in Tucson: Nelson Shaffer attended the meeting to represent the Indiana Chapter. He reported that a new directory will be published this year and they want and will include phone numbers to help the membership wanting collecting information when traveling. Nelson had copies of the National Budget and Agenda. A 20 year index of Mineralogical Record and New Mineral Localities will be published. There will be no symposium at the 1991 Tucson Show. She invited all to visit the Museum to see all the Carved Garnets.
