NEW SOUTH EAST CHAPTER HOSTS PEGMATITE SYMPOSIUM

On October 2nd, 1998 at Blacksburg Virginia, the new Southeastern Chapter of the Friends of Mineralogy with Virginia Tech and Virginia Western Community College held a symposium on "Pegmatites of the Southeastern United States".

On October 3rd the attendees were escorted underground at the Morefield Gem Mine, Amelia, Virginia, by owner Sam Dunaway. The 60 foot vertical descent by wooden ladder led to the horizontal adit which was from 6 to 15 feet wide and about 6 feet in height. There, in the core of the pegmatite, the mine walls were covered with massiveQuartz,Microline,Amazonite,Mica,Zinnwaldite, common Topaz, as well as diminutive 'Tantalite', rare Elpasolite, Prosopite, Triplite and even a bright green, softball size, Fluorite.

Midwest Chapter members Al and Sylvia Sicree, and Brad Bond were well rewarded in attending and giving support to this admirable symposium and field trip of the fledgling Southeastern Chapter.


