#### "EVAPORITES OF THE NORTHWEST MOJAVE DESERT"

This presentation will feature several evaporate deposits in the scenic and geologically dynamic northwest Mojave as well as some of the minerals common to those deposits. This small region of the northwest Mojave contains the highest, lowest and hottest places in America and is home to some of the planet's strangest flora and fauna.

Specimens will be on display.

Tina Tuttle, is an amateur mineral collector and a current grad student in Administration at IU Bloomington. She recently returned from two years of rock collecting and adventuring in the Mojave Desert where she developed her fascination with evaporites—minerals formed through evaporative processes—including many economically important minerals. Tina joined the Midwest Chapter in March 2003.

#### MINUTES - JUNE 28, 2003

The June 28, 2003, meeting of the Midwest Chapter of the Friends of Mineralogy was presided over by President Nelson Shaffer at the Monroe County Fairgrounds in Bloomington, Indiana. There were twenty-one friends and

members present.

The meeting was opened with a slide-illustrated presentation by James Mills, Professor of Geology at Depauw University, on "The Mineralogy of the Bancroft, Ontario, Area". Professor Mills described the mineralogy and possible origins of the specimens he was able to collect at the various locations in the area, some of which are open to collecting with permission from the landowners. Handsome specimens of collected apatites, biotite and titanite were available for inspection.

A short business meeting followed. The minutes of the May 3<sup>rd</sup> meeting were approved as printed in the newsletter.

Treasurer Lorraine Wright sent a report that the club's checking account balance was \$1,077.87.

Prior to the meeting, President Shaffer introduced Joel Vicary, of Michigan, who would give a MSHA (Mine Safety and Health Authority) approved training consisting of two hours of open pit mine safety and two hours of first aid leading to a certificate which along with 'site specific' training at a quarry, could improve access to collecting at that site.

New Business: Tina Tuttle volunteered to set up a silent auction at the Greenfield Show at the Hancock County Fairgrounds on Saturday, September 6, 2003. Members were asked to donate specimens with identification and estimated price. The proceeds will go to the chapter's treasury. #### GENOA, OHIO, FIELD TRIP—AUGUST 16, 2003

Seventeen field trippers attended the Genoa excursion. Weather was dry, but hot and humid. I didn't know Ohio Rte. 163 was closed on the west side of Genoa—for those that were inconvenienced, please accept my apologies. Collecting is best on the upper level and this is where we spent our time. White and colorless transparent crystals of celestine, ranging in length from several inches to thumbnail, were abundant, but difficult to extract from the rock without breaking. Celestine, which imparts a red color to a flame, is so common at the site it was hand picked in 1940 for making flares used in the Second World War. A number of members also brought out nice crystal groups of ruby sphalerite up to two inches across, pale yellow to colorless crystals of calcite and tiny crystals of iridescent pyrite.

HOSTS MSHA TRAINING FOR TITLE 30-PART 46—ROCK COLLECTING IN MINES AND QUARRIES—HAZARD RECOGNITION AND CPR/FIRST AID FOR CERTIFICATION SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 7, 2003
9:00 AM-11:00 AM (Ind. time)

The 500 Earth Sciences Club of Indianapolis, Indiana, will be hosting a Mine Safety Training Class for all interested parties. We will have the class offered in compliment to our Mineral, Fossil and Gem Show that will be held in Greenfield, Indiana, September 5-7, 2003.

The class for Mine Safety is two hours long and will be held on Sunday, September 7, 2003, at 9 am to 11 am at the Hancock County Fairgrounds. The total cost is yet to be finalized, but will probably be in the ballpark of \$30. Joel Vicary's training book will be available and its purchase is a requirement that is included in the above price.

This class plus a First Aid/CPR certificate will qualify you for obtaining a 5000-23 Certificate. The 5000-23 certificate will prove to any mine or quarry owner that you know all the safety regulations and that you know that you MUST comply with them at all times.

In order to obtain to 5000-23 certificate you must have this two hour training course and a First Aid/CPR certificate that is current. Please bring this with you as no 5000-23 certificates can be issued without proof of first aid/CPR certification as well. If you do not have a current certification, you may obtain this locally from the Red Cross, local Fire Station or the American Heart Association prior to this class. You may want to have this presented to you at one of your Rock Hounding meetings. Once you can prove certification for this training Mr. Vicary can complete your 5000-23 certificate.

A reservation is requested and we also request a \$12.00 advance to cover the cost of the Mine Safety Book. Make checks out to Joel Vicary. 




