

MINE SAFETY TRAINING

Dr Carlson and Nelson Shaffer have arranged for courses to fulfill the annual training requirement in Mine Safety. The first course was held in Bloomington, IN on February 23rd. The second course will be held in Columbus, OH on Friday, May 11 8:00 AM - 4:30 PM at The Electrical Trade Center, 947 Goodale Blvd, which is near the junction of I-670 & Ohio 315. The course will be taught by Ohio Dept Of Natural Resources in the Electrical Union Meeting Hall. Remember! Many quarrys require evidence of current training before entry. FIELD COLLECTING

Dr Carlson has indicated our first collecting opportunity of 2007 will be in April at a quarry near Ft Wayne, IN. Be watching for specific notification on location, date and time in the near future.

Are you aware of, or can you guess, how many proposed laws concerning gem, mineral, and/or fossil collecting on Federal lands are introduced in congress each year? Do you care? Last year twenty-four (24) bills were introduced. Four (4) new laws were enacted that affected your access to Federal lands in some way.

As a "not for profit" organization under Federal tax laws, FOM is prohibited from organized lobbying on political issues such as the bills mentioned above. There is an active organization that does monitor congressional activity is these areas and encourages organization members, such as you, to contact your senators and congressmen. It also lobbys against bills unfavorable to individuals' collecting opportunities. That organization is the American Lands Access Association. Membership dues are \$25.00 annually.
