

2007 ANNUAL MIDWEST FOM SYMPOSIUM

The Friends of Mineralogy fall field symposium will feature "the life of geodes - from birth to death" and will be held September 29 and 30 in south central Indiana. We will meet in Bloomington, IN at 9:00 AM on Saturday September 29 and travel to classic collecting sites in the Monroe Lake area. There we shall examine well developed geodes within their host rock. We shall then view geodes that have been weathered out or the rock and transported just a bit and now reside in soils of the Ingram farms. Thence we shall go to the Bedford area to view stream geodes many of which show fossil shapes and extensive weathering.

Lunch at Bedford will be followed by a trip to collect at the Salem Quarry by special permission. We shall stop briefly at the road cut east of Salem on State Route 56 to see geodes in place if time permits.

The evening will feature talks by well experienced "geoders" Charlie Oldham, Alan Goldstein, Dave Rush, Nelson Shaffer, Bob Harman, Jeff Smith, and other collectors. We shall stay in the Scottsburg or New Albany area Saturday ight.

On Sunday we will travel to see beginning forms of geodes that include gypsum fillings. These are the so called protogeodes. We shall have time to visit Falls of the Ohio Nature Center with its world class examples of Devonian corals (sorry NO collecting here).

For those who wish we plan a trip to Corydon in the afternoon. If you wish to attend please contact Nelson Shaffer. Participation may have to be limited. Friends of Mineralogy members will be granted first slots. We are attempting to arrange a special early bird event for those who arrive Friday evening.
