#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

As I write this, Thanksgiving is over and, despite unusually warm and sunny weather, December with cold and snowy weather is just around the corner. At the November FoM chapter meeting the new 2012 officers were elected. We now have John Davis of South Bend as our Secretary and Nelson Shaffer and Peggy Fisherkeller switched positions. Nelson is our new Treasurer and Peggy will set up club programs. Like it or not, I remain your Chapter President and Reggie Rose will schedule some field trips for the coming year.

Now something to think about. Going to big national or international shows like Tucson, Denver, and Munich, we see show themes of a national or international flavor. Some recent themes have been: "Minerals of Russia", "Minerals of China", "Pegmatite Minerals" and "Gemstone Minerals". The 2012 Tucson show theme is "Minerals of Arizona". These themes cater to the national, international and advanced collector base that comprises much of the show attendance. And rightly so. Exhibits following these show themes are usually advanced and great. But, what about the themes of our regional shows like Cincinnati or Detroit or Columbus or Louisville etc? If these shows have exhibits, which most do, then what should their themes be? Are the previously mentioned themes appropriate or should our regional shows have themes more in keeping with local collectors exhibiting locally found (or bought) minerals? And, probably more importantly, with local collectors and families with youngsters comprising the majority of these show's attendance base.

I believe it should be about the show attendees. Each show theme should be in keeping with the attendance base. The theme of each Midwest show should reflect Midwest collecting and Midwest minerals. Themes like "Calcites" or "Self Collected Midwest Minerals" or "Fluorites of the Midwest" or "Ohio Minerals" seem appropriate.

My list of regional show themes could go on and on, but the thread thru out should be relevance to the Midwest in some way and appeal to the local attendance base, especially those families with youngsters. The most important aspect, to my mind, is to make the theme and exhibits relevant to the show attendees and make some of the exhibited specimens realistically attainable to be self-collected. Youngsters can then aspire to find them and adults might be spurred on to join their local club and attend field trips.

### MORE FILL DIRT


